

2013 PETITE SIRAH STEVE BORRA'S GILL CREEK RANCH MEMBERS RESERVE

Steve Borra is a time-honored, traditional Italian winegrape-grower, using modern-day advances to nuture his vines. Petite Sirah is sort of Lodi's Pinot Noir – a notoriously challenging grape to grow. In years when this late-ripening grape squeaks in just before the first October rains – like 2013 – you can get an amazing combination of European high-quality structure with exquisite fruit.

Tasting Notes

The balance of structure to fruit is better than ever this year, delivering a pleasing rounded mouthful of nice dusty tannins wrapped around melted bittersweet chocolate over sour black cherries. The touch of sweetness in the fruit plays with the tannins to give the perception of very expensive oak that will appeal to fans of big wines, but a tartness and earthiness keep things from blowing up into an outright fruit bomb. The stuffing is there for long-term aging, but if you can't wait, put some grill marks on a New York steak with a decadent rim of juicy fat and have a feast. (05/02/2015)
